

Remembering John Horsman

I don't know how many of us look at the local obituaries in the paper, but sometimes a person who passed away will capture our interest. That person may have been a part of Tucson history or somebody that you used to work with years ago. In my case, I happen to run across an obit about John Horsman. I don't know how many of you ever met him, although he lived in Tucson for a number of years near Camino Seco and Pantano. I was lucky to meet him two times, once at the Tubac car show and once at his house where he gave me a signed copy of the book he wrote, *Racing in the Rain, My Years with Brilliant Drivers, Legendary Sports cars and a Dedicated Team.*



To plagiarize, I found some historical information on John: After completing military service as an officer in the Royal Air Force, he graduated with honors in Mechanical Sciences from Christ's College in Cambridge. He was a leading engineer, Technical Manager and Team Director in endurance sports cars at Le Mans, and Daytona 24 hour races. During his career of 40 years, he was responsible for the development, construction and race preparation of the iconic Gulf-sponsored blue and orange livered Ford GT-40's, Porsche 917's and Mirages. John's short-tail design on the Porsche 917 turned it from a fast but unstable car into one of the greatest sports racing cars of all time.

The second time I met John, was at his house, his wife Janet gave me "tea and crumpets" and he led me over to his book shelf in his sitting room and showed me the 1975 Le Mans trophy as he handed me the signed book.....pretty awesome!!!


British Wheels on the Green

From the Bonnet to the Boot



CLASSIC ENGINES, MODERN FUEL by Paul Ireland

Published earlier this year by Veloce Publishing Limited, it is the only up-to-date reference that I know of that address the problems using the currently available ethanol blended, lead free, fuel in older English built engines. Ireland has a Ph.D. in nuclear physics and is a long time MG TC owner so he has a first-hand understanding of the problems and the need for fact-based solutions. Unlike most other tuning guides and internet perpetuated opinions and half-truths, the material in this book was actually developed in the Engineering lab of the University of Manchester. Most of the data was developed using a small displacement British inline four-cylinder engine with dual "SU" carbs so are directly applicable to our cars. The research data is presented clearly, using numerous charts, drawings, photos, and graphs. The text is clearly written and easy to understand.

The book first covers the characteristics of current fuels and the effects their formulation changes make to the operation of the engine. Further, it suggests changes to the ignition and carburation necessary to address use these fuels. Overall, a lot of very interesting and useful information in a little book. I think everyone will find at least several of their long-held ideas being turned upside down and around. Maybe more importantly, we can drive knowing our older engines are better tuned and not in danger of an early demise due to the fuel with which we are stuck. I expect I will be referring to this book quite often.

Key decisions already made:


